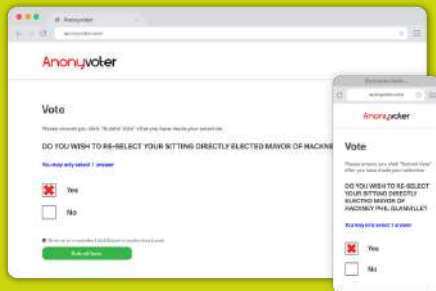
Continue our record of tackling the climate emergency by bringing forward our Net Zero plans and doubling the size of Hackney's Green Economy.
